Critics of Vocational Training

City Superintendent Declares Child Without Modern Training Comparable to Farmer Who Continues to Plow With Oxen.

If manual training, domestic science, commercial form and the other training in the public ay are "fads," then the schools today are "fads," then the steam plow, modern reapers and har-vesters and threshing machines are

"Inds of the farm."

The modern child whose intellectual provender is merely the "three rs"—
"readin', ritin' and 'rithmetic—is, in "readin", ritin" and 'rithmetic—is, in terms of proportion, to success and progress today, just what the farmer is who tills his field with oxen and threshes his grain with a fiail.

Such in brief, is the reply of L. R. Alderman. Superintendent of Public Schools, to the questions put to him as a result of the hearings on the school budget for next year. It is his rejoinder to taxpayers who have suggested the elimination of vocational training; his reply to the question: "Is the public school system faddish or does the general public need and demand the courses that are added to the curriculum from time to time?"

"I am glad you have asked about 'fads' in our school system," said Mr. Alderman yesterday, "because in these days of budget making the Superin-

Alderman yesterday, "because in these days of budget making the Superintendent's office is under a constant fire of questions as to why this or that subject needs to be introduced or retained in the curriculum at so much expense to the taxpayers, when we used to get along very well without all of these things.

pense to the taxpayers, when we used to get along very well without all of these things.

"Times have changed. Conditions have changed. Our whole economic and industrial life is utterly different from what it was 30 years ago. The boy no longer follows the occupation of his father and the girl of her mother. From the comparatively simple life of an earlier civilization we have come suddenly, it would seem, upon the highly complex problems of today.

"And yet there are people living in this age of rapid transit, of high motive power and of minutely specialized industries, who would graduate our boys and girls from the public schools, about as well equipped to face the bread and butter problem as the farmer with the ox team.

"In the old days the grade schools prepared for high school and the high schools prepared for college. Now, as a matter of fact, the greater number of toys and girls do not and never did go to college, and less than half finish high school.

"The 'fads' in the Portland schools are: Manual training, music, drawing.

"The 'fads' in the Portland schools are: Manual training, music, drawing, cooking, sewing and physical education. None of these has been added recently and no city in the country has fewer of these so-called fads. The survey of the Portland schools made three years ago criticised us for not
