

JUDGES DECIDE TO CUT JURY EXPENSES

Four Members of Circuit Court Will Set Trials for Early Part of Each Month.

PANELS TO BE DISMISSED

Rules Are Not Adopted, but Change in System So as to Benefit County is Agreed Upon—Cost to County in 1914 is \$45,825.

Your Circuit Judges met at noon yesterday and decided to reduce the county's expenses for juries as much as possible by trying their jury cases during the first part of each month and then letting the juries go home.

Annual Saving of \$20,000 Expected. If the jury cases can be tried in the first two weeks of each month, Presiding Judge Gustenbein estimates that a saving of more than \$20,000 a year can be effected.

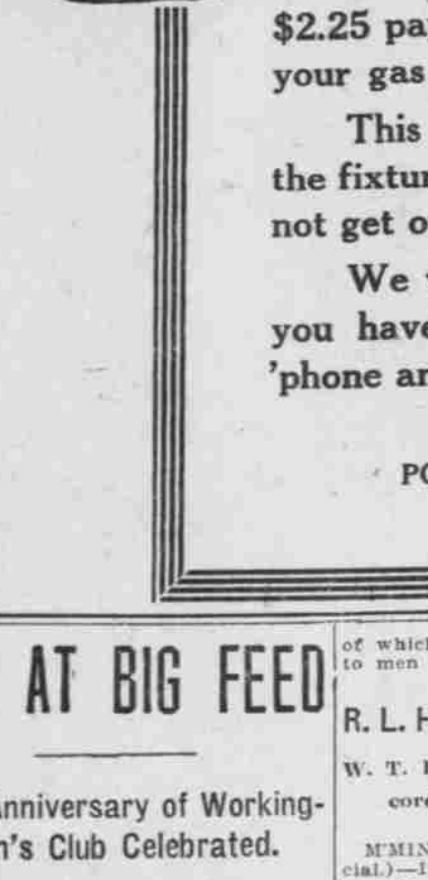

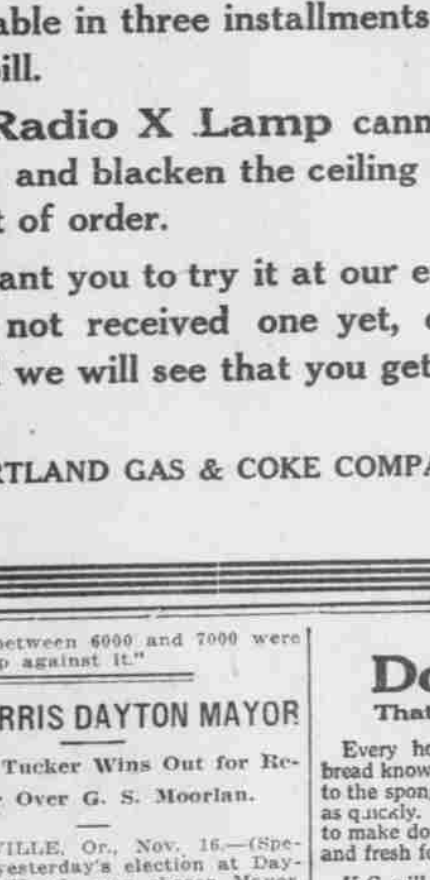
