

DOCTOR IS REFUTED

Sale of Red Cross Seals Aids Oregon, Says Mrs. Dunbar.

MONEY DOES NOT GO EAST

Secretary of State Anti-Tuberculosis Society Denies Charges Attributed to Eugene Health Officers.

A direct refutation of the charges brought against the organizations handling this sale of Red Cross seals to the State of Oregon, made by Dr. W. L. Cheshire, City Health Officer of Eugene, has been made by Mrs. Sadie Orr Dunbar, secretary of the Oregon Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis, the organization that this year will handle the sale of the Red Cross stamps in this state.

Through a news article Dr. Cheshire has made the statement that most of the money derived from the sale of the Red Cross seals in this state is sent East for distribution, and that the State of Oregon benefits little from the sale of stamps here.

Mrs. Dunbar emphatically states that the Oregon Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis, the organization that is under contract to take charge of the sale of stamps in this state for this year, has not sent to the National Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis from the fund derived from the sale of the stamps. Ten per cent of the proceeds is sent to the American Red Cross, in Washington, D. C., to help defray the expenses of printing the seals, and for a few minor expenses that accrue during the distribution of the stamps. The other 90 per cent of the proceeds, according to printing, is spent in the state in which that particular sale was effected, and the distribution is made through the organization that handles the sale.

Further, Mrs. Dunbar declares that the National Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis, with which the Oregon society is affiliated, is supported by dues from the various state organizations, and private contributions of public-spirited individuals, those contributions at times reaching \$10,000. The dues to the National organization are but 25 a year.

The Oregon Association for the prevention of tuberculosis is an organization of which A. L. Mills is president; Leslie Butler, of Hood River, vice-president; A. O. Jones, of Portland, treasurer; Mrs. Sadie Orr Dunbar, of Portland, secretary, and Dr. G. C. Bellinger, of Salem, assistant secretary-treasurer. The organization has a board of directors numbering 74 members representing all parts of the state, and the distribution is made through them and the officers of the association.

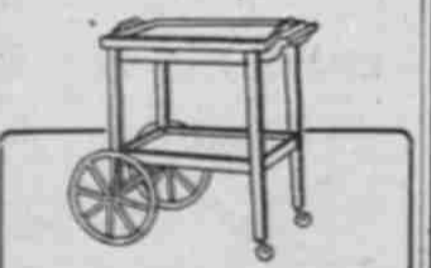
This is the first year that the Oregon Association for the prevention of tuberculosis has undertaken the sale of Red Cross seals, the Visiting Nurse Association and the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs taking charge of former sales. The same contract for the disposal of stamps has been in effect in the past as will be effective this year, 90 per cent of the money raised being spent in the state.

PACIFIC LODGES EXEMPT

Decision as to Rise in Rates Has No Effect on Coast Woodmen.

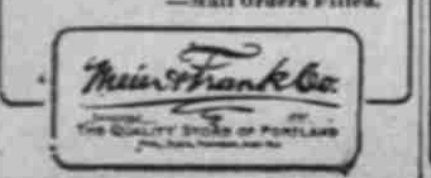
