WIND IS BLOWING GALE

Surf Is Running High and Again Is Eating Way Into Beach at Bar View-Dredge at Work Opposite Bay City Plugs Away.

BAY CITY, Or., Nov. 17 .- (Special.)-The storm of Monday which had quited lown on Tuesday, broke out again last night with renewed fury and with greater intensity than ever. The rain is falling in a sheet and the wind is blowing a gale. The great rush of water of the past three days has caused a number of slides, where fills have been made in the recent street improvements, which will cause thousands of dollars of damage.

The street work again has been stopped, as it is impossible to carry on the work under the stormy condilions existing. tions existing.

The waves in the ocean are breaking mountain high and washing clear over the jetty work which is being built at the entrance to Tillamook Hay.

Fear In Felt for Work. In a storm a month ago, five bents t piling, which had not been supported of piling, which had not been supported with a rock fill, were washed away and it is feared that the present storm which is of greater severity, will damage the work. Rock has been dumped as rapidly as possible in an effort to add greater stability to the piling and it is hoped that the jetty work will withstand the beating of the swells and waves. The pile-driver is kept fired up ready for instant work if it should be necessary to drive additional supports.
