Refusal to Convict Engineer of Cruiser Declared Miscarriage of Justice.

MEMBERS SHARPLY RAPPED

Secretary Says He Is Unwilling to Believe Ideals of Duty Are So Low as to Exonerate Lieutenant of Neglect.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—In a state-ment issued today Secretary Daniels takes exception sharply to the verdict of the Navy court-martial in the cases of the Navy court-martial in the cases of the two commissioned officers and one warrant officer charged with responsibility for a fatal boiler explosion on the cruiser San Diego last January. The court-martial found Lieutenant till guilty and sentenced him to lose to numbers, but with a recommendation for elemency. It acquitted Chief Engineer Oak and Chief Machinist O'Donnell.

Secretary Daniels remitted Hill's sen-ence because Oak was not punished

Court Rapped by Secretary. "I am unwilling to believe that the ideals of duty and responsibility of all members of the court are so low as to exonerate Lieutenant Oak of neglect of duty," said the Secretary's statement.

Lieutenant Hill save the order to draw fires as the last sign of water vanished from in a the last sign of water vanished from the gauges, but he was a few seconds too late and the explosion followed.

A beard of inquiry recommended that charges be filed against others of the crew, but the heroism of the men during the explosion and immediately afterwards, when the boiler and engine-rooms were filled with live steam, resulted in an order to drop the cases against them.

In addition to the three officers, Chief Water Tender William I, Appleby was tried and acquitted.
