DANIELS CLASHES WITH NAVY COURT

Refusal to Convict Engineer of Cruiser Declared Mis-carriage of Justice.

MEMBERS SHARPLY RAPPED

Secretary Says He Is Unwilling to Believe Ideals of Duty Are So Low as to Exonerate Lieutenant of Neglect.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—In a statement issued today Secretary Daniels takes exception sharply to the verdict of the Navy court-martial in the case of the two commissioned officers and one warrant officer charged with responsibility for a fatal boiler explosion on the cruiser San Diego last January.

The court-martial found Lieutenant Hill guilty and sentenced him to lose his rank and pay, but with a recommendation for clemency. It acquitted Chief Engineer Oak and Chief Machinist O'Donnell.

Secretary Daniels remitted Hill's sentence because Oak was not punished also.

"I am unwilling to believe that the ideals of duty and responsibility of all members of the court are as low as to exonerate Lieutenant Oak of neglect of duty," said the Secretary's statement.
