IDEAL LIFE IS DEPICTED

Burbank Cactus Evolution Is Likened to Transformation of Man From Natural Savagery Under Influence of Christ.

PHRASES FROM BISHOP GRANSTON'S SERMON.

Life is God's way of doing things. Love is God's reason for doing things. Law is God's way of doing things. Genesis is a star that shines in a small circle and sees not its own sun. Manhood must be more than its most brilliant light.

The law sets forth the standards of the individual life, and humanity has been responding to those standards for centuries. But until Jesus Christ came into the world there was no greater ideal than that set by the law.

When Paul realized the hopelessness of his task of inspiring the people through his own efforts, he pointed them to Christ as the only avenue through which they might be spiritualized.

An interesting parallel between plant and human life was drawn by Bishop Granston when he declared that the same procedure which Luther Burbank applied to the cactus to transform it from a plant that was repellent to the taste, poisonous to the blood and painful to the touch, was applicable in the transformation of the man to whom self preservation is the first law of nature.
