OREGON PLUCK MORE IN EVIDENCE THAN LUCK

Football Critic Says University Outplayed Aggies in Every Department and Thinks on Dry Field Would Have Won by Far Greater Score.

BY OLIVER E. HESTON, Former Star Reporter, Oregon. I WOULD like to make a few comments on the O. A. C.-Oregon football game of last Saturday. I would not do this only I was so dissatisfied with the reports that appeared in this Oregonian and Journal, by the papers. Both of the writers attribute practically all of Oregon's victory to luck and to the fact that the Aggies were outplayed by a long way to give the team the credit it deserves. Evidently the writers thought it was impossible for the team that had whipped the Michigan Aggies to be beaten by any local aggregation and hated to go back on the different belittling comments they had made about the Oregon team previous to the game. This talk about Oregon luck makes me sick. Year after year Oregon out-games and outplays the Aggies and is there with the punch at the crucial time, and there is a big howl going on from the Aggie backers that Corvallis played by far the best game and that the only place Oregon excelled was in the back.

Oregon Superior Throughout. The truth is, that luck had nothing to do with winning Saturday's game. It was apparent to all fair-minded observers that the university team was superior in every department of the game without one exception. Oregon outplayed, outthought, outkicked and outgamed the Aggies from start to finish. They made a far less number of fumbles, they recovered almost twice as many fumbles and their passing was perfect.

The Corvallis center gave a sorry exhibition compared to Risley's work. There was absolutely not a flash in the work of the Aggies with one exception and that was Monteth's failure to recover the punt and the inside kick which gave Corvallis her near-chance in the last of the game. The work of the Oregon line was a revelation. I have been directly interested in college football for the past 16 years, including three years spent at Yale, during which time I saw practically all of the big Eastern teams and many of those of the Middle West, and I can candidly state that never have I seen a line that showed up better from beginning to end of a game even on the big Eastern teams. When Oregon would drop into punt formation, the varsity line would hold like a stone wall and there was not the slightest danger of a punt's being blocked, and Oregon punted probably around 50 times or more. On the other hand, the Corvallis kicker was always rushed in his work, which

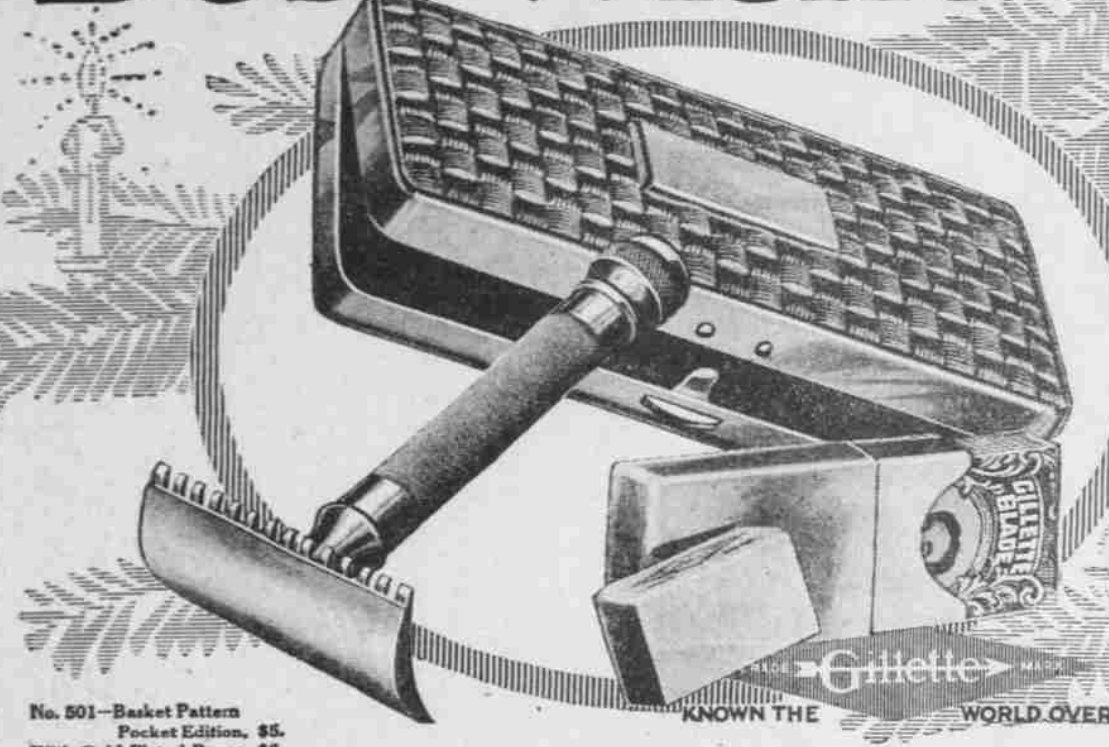

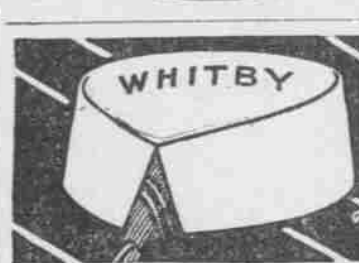
