BANK APPEAL PENDING

FEDERAL RESERVE BOARD TO ASK INTERPRETATION OF LAW.

Action Is Deferred on Changes in Locations and Realignment of Boundary Districts.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—Attorney-General Gregory will be asked by the Federal Reserve Board to interpret the provisions of the Federal reserve act and to determine whether, in his opinion, the Board has authority to reduce the number of reserve districts. The Board had reached the question for several hours in connection with the location of reserve banks and realignment of the boundary of reserve districts.

The appeals now before the Board include that of Baltimore to be designated as a reserve bank in place of Cleveland in the same capacity; that of banks in Southern Wisconsin to be shifted from the Minneapolis to the Chicago district; that of banks in Western Connecticut to be shifted to the New York from the Boston district; and that of banks in Louisiana to be included in the Dallas district, instead of the Atlanta district.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—The International Institute of Agriculture at Rome forecasts the 1915 production of corn in the world as follows: Romania, European Russia, Switzerland, Canada, United States, Japan and 10 governments of Asiatic Russia at 2,594,000,000 bushels, or 11.5 per cent, compared with the preceding year.

40 FORTRESSES CAPTURED

Some of Strongest Works in World Taken by Teutons.

BERLIN, Nov. 23.—(By wireless to Sayville.)—Forty fortresses have been captured by the armies of the central powers to date, according to a compilation made by the Overseas News Agency. Five of these fortresses were in Belgium, 12 were in France, 15 were in Russia and eight were in Serbia.

BON MARCHE LOSS HEAVY

Estimate of Damage Is Put at 30,000,000 Francs.

PARIS, Nov. 23.—The loss in the fire yesterday in the apex of the Bon Marche, one of the largest department stores in Paris, is estimated at least 20,000,000 francs (\$6,000,000).

CANADIANS TAKING LOAN

\$25,000,000 of \$50,000,000 Goes to Banks, Insurance Companies.

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 23.—The Canadian \$25,000,000 war loan came on the market Monday and at noon it was announced from the finance department that the chartered banks had offered to take \$25,000,000 of the loan and that insurance companies would subscribe for the remainder.

MORE CANADIANS WILL GO

Force of 160,000 Authorized for Service in Europe.

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 23.—Announcement was made today by the MILITIA Department that 145 Canadian infantry battalions, with a total war strength of 160,000 men, exclusive of artillery, engineers and other branches of the service, had been authorized up to date.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—On representations from the American Government, the American bark Anshoff, which was bound from San Francisco to Halmstad, Sweden, with a cargo of beans, and was towed into Christiansand with a British prize crew aboard, has been released.
