BLOW AIMED AT MR. DIECK

Mayor Effects Change in Mr. Baker's Ordinance Extending Scope to All Departments-Prejudiced Acts Charged.

By means of an amendment interposed yesterday in the general blanket ordinance appropriating the salaries and other items of supplies for 1916 as set forth in the recently adopted city budget, Commissioner Baker hopes force Commissioner Dieck to submit to the Council all salary changes before

to the Council all salary changes before putting them into effect.

The amendment was adopted forcing Mr. Dieck and all the other Commissioners to submit for Council approval all proposed salary reductions. He aiready is required to submit all plans for salary increases.

The plan of Mr. Baker stirred up a tilt with Mayor Albee, who resented the idea of any further sitacks on Mr. Dieck's budget. Mr. Dieck was not

Diech's budget. Mr. Dieck was not present. The Mayor finally got Mr. Baker's amendment amended to include all Commissioners as well as Mr. Dieck. Mr. Baker said that as long as it took in Mr. Dieck he was agreeable, for that was the part of the service he was "getting at."
