MRS. A. C. GIBBS DIES

Widow of "War Governor" Nearly 86 Years Old.

LONG LIFE FULL OF DEEDS

From Arrival in Oregon in 1854 Active Part Is Taken in State's Welfare and in Church and Charitable Work.

With the death of Mrs. Addison C. Gibbs, which took place on Wednesday night at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Alexander Muir, one of Portland's oldest and most interesting citizens passed away. She was the wife of Oregon's first Governor.

Mrs. Gibbs was one of the oldest members of the First Methodist Church, having united with that body in 1829. She was born in New York State January 5, 1830, and went to school in Springfield, N. Y., where she was graduated. It was while in school that she met Addison Gibbs, and their marriage in 1854 resulted.

The same year the couple came west by way of a reception honoring the wives of all the ex-Governors. It was a matter of regret to Mrs. Gibbs that she was not strong enough to attend, but she took a decided interest in the affair and when interviewed told of the

days in which her husband had been Governor. She said she was busy rearing her children while her husband was state executive.

Mrs. Gibbs was the mother of seven children, three of whom, Charles W. Gibbs, of Wallace, Idaho; Mrs. P. I. Packard, of Underwood, Wash.; and Mrs. Muir, of Portland; survive her.

The public career of Mr. Gibbs began immediately after his arrival here. He was a legislator from Douglas County and was elected Governor in 1852. For his activities in leading in the protection of Oregon against the Indians, he was known as "The War Governor."

Miss M. A. Roberts Goes East to Meet Relatives Whom She Never Knew.

BROTHER SOLVES MYSTERY

Young Woman Has Sisters at Louisville and Chicago—Parents' Death and Children's Adoption Scattered Family.

To meet a brother and two sisters whom she has never seen, Miss Marie A. Roberts, of Portland, will start Sunday for Chicago, Cincinnati and Louisville.

Until a year ago her birth and the identity of her parents was a complete mystery to her. A year ago Miss Roberts' brother, who is G. W. Miller, employed in the office of the Big Four Railroad in Cincinnati, located his sister in Portland through the Chief of Police here.

Through her brother Miss Roberts has learned that she has a sister, Mrs. M. C. McGregor, living at 2022 Wabash avenue, Chicago, and another sister, Mrs. G. G. Brown, living in Louisville.

During her life in Portland Miss Roberts educated herself and gained a wide circle of friends. She has been a member of the Gullish Club and also of the Troubadour Club.

Miss Roberts tells packing a huge trunk yesterday to tell her story. "I don't even know what my father's name was," she said. "My brother hasn't told me in any of his letters. He merely said that father was a criminal lawyer in Louisville. I was brought either by my foster-parents when I was a baby and remember nothing."

"My brother is G. W. Miller and he is employed in the office of the Big Four Railroad in Cincinnati. But Miller wasn't my father's name. My brother, too, was adopted after my mother's death and he assumed that name. I haven't corresponded with either of my sisters, whose names were given me by my brother."

"Yes, I am glad to go. It is something I have experienced in before. I never knew what it was to have real brothers and sisters. I will go first to Cincinnati to meet my brother and then to Louisville, where I will meet my sister. He was about 25 years old, and has one brother in the Buchanan community and there are no other relatives known."
