



WHEAT IN STORAGE SEIZED BY CANADA

Dominion Takes Sudden Official Action.

GRAIN REQUIRED BY BRITAIN

Order Affects 20,000,000 Bushels in Eastern Elevators.

PRICE NOT YET FIXED

Government Says Move Is Made to Prevent Undue Speculative Profits and to Save Canadian Market From Loss.

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 28.—The Canadian government has commandeered all high-grade wheat in elevators from Fort William, on Lake Superior, to the Atlantic Coast.

The action was taken under the special war act by the Canadian Grain Commission. The wheat seized was of grades No. 1 hard and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 northern. It was the property of grainshippers and millers. That taken in all which on Saturday night was in the public elevators at Fort William, Fort Arthur, Midland, Tiffin, Fort McNichol, Collingwood, Coderick, Kingston, Fort Colborne, Prescott, Quebec, St. John, Montreal and Halifax.
