Behind closed doors, and with only a few select friends and newspapermen present, the Syracuse University football eleven held two scrimmages yesterday on Multnomah field—one in the foggy morning against Syracuse scrubs, and another in the early afternoon against the 145-pound Columbia Parks, of the Inter-city Football League.

As Syracuse is booked to play the Oregon Aggies tomorrow afternoon in the most important intercollegiate football game of many years, great care was taken by Coach O'Neil, of Syracuse, that no advance information leaked out of the scrimmage.

However, it can be said without violation of any confidence, that the Columbia Parks scored a touchdown and did it without semblance of a fluke. Young Eugene Murphy, of the Columbia team, intercepted one of Meek's forward passes and ran about 55 yards for a touchdown.

Syracuse Gets Four Touchdowns.

Syracuse made four touchdowns in a few minutes and perhaps would have scored another had not the Parks pulled a new one on Fuller, a long man. Wilkinson was called for a long run in the goal on this occasion, when suddenly a green-awarded Park substitute catapulted from the sidelines and pulled the Syracuse backs to earth as slick and clean as though he had been hit by a 45-centimeter shell.

It was just such a stunt as you often see in amateur games and it created great deal of excitement among the few spectators present.

Owing to the gag rule invoked by Coach O'Neil it is not possible to tip off much concerning the Syracuse formations, but suffice to say, the New Yorkers are as big in uniform as they are toiled.

White and Schlichter Looming.

White and Schlichter, the giants of the two teams, loomed up like twin behemoths in a duckpond. These are the two blockers who were chosen on the all-American teams by vote of the various college critics.

Under present conditions the elements will be Cole, the 195-pound center, and "Humpy" Smith, 132-pound tackle.

White and Schlichter are both line-backers while Cole was born on a farm in Kansas and Smith had his roots aboard buckskin cayuses in the hills of Oregon.

Cole is the big fellow who holds the Pacific Coast diving record with a mark well over 140 feet and who also holds the distinction of being American's strongest college athlete. Like big White he lacks a little of the aggressiveness of the other rival pair of guards, but with it will be interesting to watch the outcome of this "battle of the guards."

Aggies Arrive Today.

Coach Stewart and his Oregon Aggie stars are expected in Portland this morning and both teams likely will work out with Syracuse in the afternoon. There were rumors yesterday floating about that big Laythe, the Aggies' star tackle, might be kept out of the fray by a "bad" cold.

If this is true it will hurt their chances. Hefer was hurt in the Oregon game, but may be in shape to fill in anywhere in the line in case of injuries.

Setting on the outcome of the Syracuse-Aggie game favors the Syracuseans slightly. Odds of 10 to 3 are being quoted, with Syracuse as the favorite and many of the wisecracks are betting even money and giving the Aggies seven points.

These odds against the Oregon Aggies are not justified by comparative scores, but they are by other lines of endeavor.

Comparative Scores Show.

Here's one chain of comparative scores: Syracuse beat Michigan 14 to 7 and the Michigan Aggies beat Michigan 14 to 0 and the Oregon Aggies beat the Michigan Aggies 28 to 0.

Therefore, in this little out of statistics the Western team would appear to be about four touchdowns superior to Syracuse.

Aggie, Montana beat Idaho 10 to 2 and the Oregon Aggies beat Idaho 40 to 0 and Montana tied Syracuse 6 to 6.

This set of scores would seem to give the Aggies five extra touchdowns.
