Washington's Threat to Quit Brings Possibility of All-Coast Conference.

STANFORD IS CONSIDERED

University May Not Be Able to Force Conference Members into Line. Developments Are Expected at Meeting December 2.

SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 29.—(Special.)—The threat of the University of Washington to sever athletic relations with other colleges of the Pacific Northwest is causing the same rule, passed by Washington, barring freshmen from athletic teams, to be passed by the conference officials, may not have the effect of forcing the conference members into line as J. Arthur Tompser, Washington's graduate manager, is quoted as having forecast.

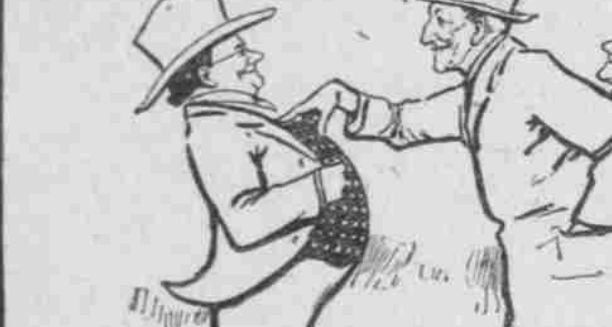
