# **3 DELEGATES NAMED**

Conference Ostensibly for Indorsement of Jones Bill.

### 17 STATES TO PARTICIPATE

San Francisco Meeting Slightly Mysterious and Suspicion Exists That Administration May Introduce Ferris Bill, Too.

South Dakota, Wyoming, Colorado, Na-braska, Kansas, Okiahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Utah and Nevada. Provision is made for appointment of delegates as follows: Three from each irrigation district, the Secretary of the Interior and other officials of the In-terior Department, the Governor of each state, three delegates to be named by sach, three delegates to be named by each Governor, one from each commer-cial organization, one from each clear-ing-house association, three from each railroad operating in the affected states, one from each labor council and one from each engineering society.

It is announced that another meeting

is to be held later in some Eastern city at which every state in the Union is to be represented, and for the purpose of procuring Nation-wide indorsement of the Jones bill.
Mr. Brewer and the other Oregon delegates are cordially in favor of the Jones bill, but if any attempt is made at San Francisco to inderse the Ferris bill they will raise their voices loudly

in the negative.
