

BANK MESSENGER AND ROBBER KILLED

Assailant, Who Carries Three Revolvers, Is Wounded in Ensuing Fight.

CROWD SEES ENCOUNTER

Robber Grabs Bag Containing \$4000 in Rush Hour at New York Subway Station—Police Finally Fells Him.

NEW YORK, Dec. 4.—Alan Gardner, a bank messenger, and George De Rosa, a robber, died late tonight from bullet wounds received in a sensational attempt made by the latter to steal a bag containing \$4000 in the Fourteenth-street subway station in the rush hour late today.

The messengers were employees of the Bank of the Metropolitan Union Square, near the scene of the holdup. De Rosa, who was armed with three revolvers, carried nearly 200 cartridges and a bag of clothes, walked up behind the messengers and fired two shots into the head of Gardner, who carried a floor amid the cries of the subway throng, the robber threw away the revolver, seized the bag and fled. A man gave chase and drew a bullet lodging in the messenger's coat collar.

BOMB CODE IS CHARGED

IRON WORKERS' PHRASES ARE OFFERED AS TESTIMONY.

Letters Taken From International Association Are Used Against Times Explosion Suspect.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 3.—Letters taken from "high winds" and "organization work" phrases alleged to relate to a dynamiting conspiracy said to have existed among the members of the International Association of Bridge & Structural Iron Workers, were read into the records all day today in the trial of Matthew A. Schindler, charged with murder as the result of the Los Angeles Times explosion five years ago.

Among the letters, which were all taken from the files of the International Association in Indianapolis, was one purporting to be from Herbert S. Hookin, of Detroit, to J. J. McNamara, secretary-treasurer of the association, and dated December 1, 1904. In discussing a cargo derrick operated by an "open shop" concern, it reads in part as follows:

GRANT ACTION DOUBTED

SENATOR LANE TO OFFER NO BILL REGARDING LANDS.

Oregon & California Controversy Likely Would be Complicated by Congressional Measure, It Views.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Dec. 3.—Senator Lane, of Oregon, will introduce no bill bearing on the Oregon & California land grant. "The less legislation Congress enacts on this subject," he said tonight, "the better it will be. Under the Supreme Court decision there is little that Congress can do, although it can probably define an actual settler, and it probably can in some way fix the time when the lands must be sold. It can also direct that the lands be offered for sale immediately under the terms of the grant, or it can pass a law requiring the railroad company to sell upon demand of any bona-fide settler."

Oregon Committeeman Not to Make Personal Fight for Place.
