Cargo of Foodstuffs for South America Is Carried.

GALE BLOWING AT SEA

French Bark Pierre Antoine Off River Mouth—Cornell Bart Docks at Linnton—Steamer Erroll Is Due Here Soon.

With a cargo consigned to the West Coast of South America, the Grace Line steamer Santa Cecilia dropped down the river yesterday, reaching Astoria at 2:30 P. M.

The French bark Pierre Antoine, which was picked up outside the Columbia River by the Portland tug Onocenta at 1:30 Saturday afternoon, was still outside last night, according to information received.

The Pierre Antoine is under charter to M. H. Houser to lead grain here for Europe.

The French bark Cornell Bart, which made Astoria Saturday morning, was brought up to Linnton yesterday.

The Erroll is under charter to Kerr, Gifford & Co., and is a vessel of 2332 tons.

HENRY CLEWS GIVES VIEWS

New York Banker Declares That With Accession to Position of World Power Foreign Markets Must Be Cultivated.

One beneficial effect of the European war, says Henry Clews, the well-known New York banker, is the realization that it has brought to American business men that the United States is a world power in the field of commerce.

"We must awaken to the fact that we are a nation of grown-ups; we must take our place in the world's affairs accordingly and adapt ourselves to the new opportunities and new obligations that are fast pressing upon us.

There are but two things now necessary for securing a higher market for American manufacturers, and that is the co-operation of the American investor and American labor, both of which can be had intelligently reasoned with and led.
