Pioneer of 1853 Prominently Identified With City's Growth. FUNERAL TO BE TOMORROW

Early Resident of Portland Passes at Age of 83 Years After Life of Activity as Manufacturer, Merchant and Official.

James W. Going, a pioneer of 1853, died yesterday morning at the home street. With his passing there was closed the life of one who had been prominently identified with the early history and upbuilding of the City of Portland.

Mr. Going was born in Baltimore, Md., in August, 1832. He left Baltimore in March, 1857, and crossed the plains with Charles E. Fendall and George Frazier on his way to Oregon.
