Sausage Conveys Deadly Worm. Those affected in the present in stance are sausage which had been poorly cooked.

The immediate symptoms of the dread gisease are very similar to ptomaine poisoning, but later develop into a fever of the typhus variety. The disease is not caused by a germ, but by a microscopic worm, "trichinelia spirellis." The worm eats its way through the The worm eats its way through the intestinal tract, burrows through blood-vessel walk and usually settles in the voluntary muscles, causing intense pain. So great was the pain secompanying respiration that the patients who died succumbed because they could not summon the will power to force them to breathe in spite of the agony.


