BAD PORK TRAGEDY

Hogs Killed Because Suffering From Malady.
MISSOURI MINISTER SEARCHED FOR.
Boston police have asked Portland authorities to aid in the search for Rev. James H. Bennett, a minister who mysteriously dropped from sight in San Francisco last October. He wrote daily letters to Boston people until October 20 and had not been heard from since that time. He then intended to return to Boston, via Portland and Seattle. He is described as 44 years old, 5 feet 8 inches tall, 150 pounds, with a sandy mustache, light brown hair, light blue eyes and unusually good teeth. He was not a drinking man.

4 PERSONS DIE; 10 ILL.
Dr. Brooke Discovers Trichinosis and Silences Medical Ricinosis.
Post-Mortem Shows Deadly Meat Caused "Typhoid."
That it was a farmer living not far from Portland who discovered his hogs were sick from a disease unknown to him, killed them and shipped the carcasses to a front-street commission merchant, with the result that four people are dead, one is dying and 10 others have traces of trichinosis which may develop fatally, is indicated by information that has come into the possession of Dr. Banner B. Brooke, the physician who first discovered that the disease existed in Portland.

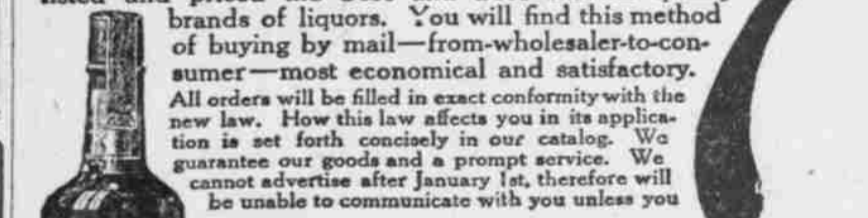
