DRY ACT IS EASY TO ENFORCE,

Salem Conference Friday Is Considered Important in Bringing About Uniform Action.

"It is necessary for the District At-"It is necessary for the District Attorney's of Oregon to get together and agree on a uniform line of procedure in enforcing the prohibition law," said George Neuner, Jr., District Attorney of Dougias County and secretary of the District Attorneys' Association of Oregon, who arrived here last night from Roseburg.

"The new law is a radical departure from the old local option statute," continued District Attorney Neuner, "and is going to be much easier to enforce.

"For instance, under the local option regulations we had to prove actual sale to convict, which was difficult. But under the new order of things, there are half a dozen ways to get both the seller and buyer of liquors. Even the reputation of a place is evidence.

"The District Attorneys of the state already have resolved to enforce this new statute right from the start. They have the pledge of the Attorney General's office to aid in every way. The Governor has the power to displace a District Attorney if the law is not enforced."
