SALMON-PACKING ONE OF GREAT INDUSTRIES.

In 1915 there were packed in Oregon 714,108 cases of salmon, which had a total weight of more than 21,453 tons. If all this food could be made into one huge salmon, the fish would be more than 1200 feet long and its greatest width would be more than 450 feet. The total pack required 34,325,000 cans. If these cans were laid end to end they would make one continuous chain extending from Portland to Tia Juana, Mexico, and back-a distance of 1800 miles-or would form an unbroken line along the railroad tracks between Portland

The value of these cans alone totals nearly \$500,000 and the paper labels used on them cost approximately \$28,000. The wooden boxes in which they were packed have a value to the manufacturer of \$85,000. Oregon's salmon pack in 1915 was exceeded only oncein 1895, when 712,574 cases were produced. The total value of the 1915 output was nearly \$6,000,-
