

NORTHWEST HELD IN GRIP OF STORM

Wind, Snow and Rain Sweep Over Wide Territory; Gale 80 Miles at Bay City.

SLIDES BLOCK ALL LINES

Portland Has 1.93-Inch Rainfall and Wind That Plays Pranks With Umbrellas, Keeping Tardy Shoppers in Discomfort.

Portland has 1.93 inch of rain, the most in nearly four times as great as it was at this time last year.

Railroad officials reported that the snow was 19 feet deep on parts of the mountain line unprotected by the snowshed.

The lines of the Northern Pacific and the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul are open to traffic and the Great Northern last night began sending its transcontinental trains over the Northern Pacific tracks between Seattle and Spokane.

No trains were caught between the slides, and except for many hours delay necessitated by sending the trains back to connections with the Northern Pacific, passengers suffered no inconvenience.

Great Northern officials said they hoped to have their line cleared before tomorrow.

Trains on the Union Pacific east of Portland are held until the tracks near Wyath. A big force of men is at work clearing the obstruction.

The Southern Pacific main line service is not affected. The Tillamook line of the Southern Pacific was held but, however, and all trains are indefinitely delayed.

CHEHALIS STREETS FLOODED

Sawmills Shut Down and Farmers Worrying About Stock.

CHEHALIS, Wash., Dec. 21.—(Special.)—The storm which has prevailed in this section of Southwest Washington the past 48 hours is the worst for this winter.

The Chehalis and Newaukum valleys will see the highest water of two years. Railroad traffic was seriously interrupted by washouts, slides and other causes.

The Washington-Oregon power plants on Kalama River and at Yonahs supplying Southwest Washington with light and power are out of service tonight.

Locally the storm has been so severe that the streets were flooded for hours during the day. All the sawmills in this vicinity have shut down.

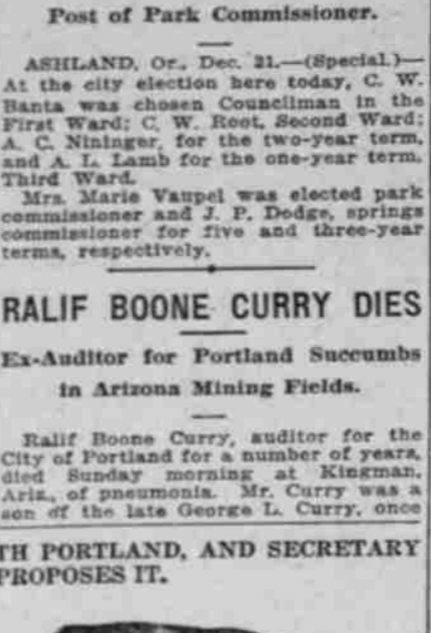
