NEW YORK, Dec. 21.—Colonel E. M. House, confidential adviser of President Wilson, said today that he would shortly said for Europe at the request of the President

of the President. clonel House declared that the sole Columni House declared that the sole purpose of his trip would be to deliver to certain American Ambassaders in-formation regarding this Government's attitude on various international mat-ters now pending. He denied emphatic-ally that his trip will is any way be a neare mission.

Colenel Heuse announced that he expected to sail from here within the wext two weeks, and probably would be in Europe at re eight weeks.
"I am going to Europe at the request of the Freshiant and the Secretary of State, for the purpose of taking information to some of our Ambassadors, he said, "in order that they may have more intimate knowledge of this Government's attitude regarding certain phases of international questions and in order to obtain from them their point of view on these matters.

"It is not advisable to bring home at this time any of our Ambassadors from

MISSION IS DELICATE ONE

Secretary Lausing Declines to Discuss Mr. House's Errand.

WASHINGTON. Dec. 21.—Secretary Lansing tenight declined to add anything to the announcement by Colonel House that he was going to Europe at the request of the President and Secretary of State.

From other official sources, however, came the intimation that the international questions which Colonel House is to take up with American Ambassadors at the capitals of belligerent powers were of such an extremely delicate nature that they could not be discussed. It was suggested that Colonel House's statement should be taken at its face value, and questions as to whether he would make informal inquiries concerning the prospects of peace slicited no response.

Colonel House, who is the President's close personal friend and adviser, made an extended tour of European capitals last spring and talked with high government officials of Germany, France and England. There was much speculation at the time as to the object of the trip, and the circulation of varied reports caused the Colonel to deny that he sided as the personal representative of President Wilson or had gone on

reports caused the Coloner to deny that he acted as the personal representative of President Wilson or had gone on a mission of peace. He said he traveled as a private citizen, but indicated that, so a loyal citizen should do he would communicate such information of moment as had come to him to the President

Later he had a long conference with Later has had a rong conference with the President and was understood to have given him a comprehensive state-ment of the opinion abroad as he ob-served it. What he reported was never revealed, but it is known that his pic-ture of the situation did not after the President's belief that the time then was not ripe for any steps from Washing-ton toward initiating a peace move-

ment.
In the course of his tour, Colonel House talked with Premier Asquith, David Lloyd George and Lord Kitchener in London; President Peincare and Minister of Foreign Affairs Deicasse in Paris, and Foreign Minister von Jagaw, Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg and Under Secretary of State Zimmerman in Berlin.

FRENCH CALL CRUISER OFF

American Ships Not to Be Searched, Pending Decisions.


