

# RATE CUT FAR-REACHING

HALF OF UNSOLD INLAND EMPIRE GRAIN AFFECTED BY ORDER.

Spokane Chamber Asks Commission t Grant Benefit Immediately Instead of Within 30 Days.

SPOKANE, Wash, Jan. 2.—(Special.)—Fully one-half of the grain crop of the Inland Empire, which at this date remains unsold, is affected by the rate reduction of 71% cents a hundred granted to shippers by the Interstate Commerce Commission on less than 80.000 pounds minimum cars to Chicago and St. Louis.

The new rate will take effect on the northern roads on February 5 and will affect immediately more than 5,000,000 bushels of grain in this territory which will go East for export, with as much more to mills.




