

WILSON CALLED ON FOR MEXICAN DATA

Senators Demand Information and Criticize Recognition of Carranza Regime.

ACTION IS UNANIMOUS

Confirmation of Nomination of New Ambassador Awaits Development—Senator Williams Demands Sale of Munitions.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Mexico furnished the vehicle today for another discussion of foreign relations on the floor of the Senate. It provided the adoption without opposition of a resolution offered by Senator Fall calling on President Wilson for all available information bearing on the recognition of the Carranza government by the United States.

Senator Fall and Lodge spoke in favor of the resolution, insisting that the President should inform Congress fully concerning the situation before nomination of an Ambassador to Mexico was confirmed.

Opening of Congress Criticized

Senator Fall laid stress on the President's failure to take Congress into his confidence when considering recognition of a foreign government.

"I have never known a time before," he declared, "when any President has dared to ignore the Congress of the United States as it has been ignored by the present occupant of the White House."

Senator Lodge said that the resolution should be adopted.

Felley Rapped by Lodge

"To our Ambassador," he asked, "to go to Mexico City where Carranza has not come, or will be following the fitting camp of the first chief wherever it goes? Recently not only in Mexico, but elsewhere, our Government has adopted a plan of dealing through fictive agents of a personal nature."

"I think it probably desirable, however, that we have a recognized Ambassador in Mexico to look after the Americans who remain until murdered there and fragments of property that are left, but I think we should be informed officially by the President regarding the government to which he is to be assigned."

"The right of self-government," said Senator Williams, of Mississippi, "is inseparably connected with the right of self-maintenance. Mexican affairs cannot be settled by any amount of spasmodic interference, and if you try to do it by assassination, you'll fail. You cannot make a Mexican self-governing by any amount of interference."

Munitions Embargo Opposed

Senator Williams diverted attention from Mexico in the course of the debate by commenting at length on questions arising from the war. He said an embargo on exports of munitions would "hamstring" the United States more than any other first-class power.

Senator Borah wanted to know whether the Mississippi Senator thought that after the war some European government would attack the United States out of pure spirit of conquest.

"I am not anticipating an attack in the first place," Senator Williams replied. "I am anticipating bullying first, and I am anticipating the fact that the American people will not consent to be bullied."

Subjects for Quarrels Identified

He declared there would be plenty to quarrel about, referring to repeated torpedoing of unarmed merchant ships by one nation and by the ally of that nation after the question involved apparently had been settled by diplomacy.

"They are in the field of diplomacy now, and the President of the United States has wisely attempted to keep them within the field of diplomacy," he added. "I am sorry, for one, that Congress has to meet right now. I think the management of our diplomatic affairs would have been more wisely handled by a man long visioned and deep visioned and tender visioned, like all three of them."

"They are apt to be mismanaged when they are made a game of battles and shuttled on the floor of these two houses, even when I am one who plays the game."

VETERAN PUBLISHER DIES

Charles W. Knapp Expires Suddenly in New York Office.

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—Charles W. Knapp, treasurer of the New York Times and formerly editor and publisher of the St. Louis Republic, died suddenly today in the office of the Times.

Mr. Knapp's death was due to heart disease. He was 59 years old and was one of the organizers and incorporators of the Associated Press and the Newspaper Publishers' Association. He was a member of the board of directors of the Associated Press at the time of his death.

LINER FLEES SUBMARINE

HYPHEN FOLK TOLD TO GET OFF EARTH

Federal Judge Extends Invitation to Citizens Not for America Above All.

ALIEN BIRTH HELD ILL LUCK

Remarks Are Made to Grand Jury Called to Investigate Munition Plant Explosions Charged to German Agents.

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—An invitation to "hyphenated citizens" who put the interests of their native country before those of America to "get off the face of the earth" was issued here today by United States Judge Clayton, of Alabama.

Judge Clayton's remarks were made in addressing the grand jury that was empaneled to resume the investigation into the activity of German agents in this country.

"You gentlemen," he said, "are entering on your duties as American citizens. If any of you have had the misfortune to be born in a foreign country, I beg to give you a truthful saying that you love America more than the land of your birth. I have no sympathy with any naturalized citizen who is given to carping criticism of this Government, or who cannot say that he loves America first, last and forever."

"If any citizen has come here from another country to evade military service let him not criticize our institutions here. If he desires to do so let him get off the face of the earth or go back and fight for the country from whence he came."

"We don't care what foreigners or foreign nations think of our methods of government. We care only for the good of our country. We have proved pre-eminently successful. At present we are doing our best to carry out the precepts of the great father of our country, George Washington, by keeping our minds strictly on our own business and avoiding entangling alliances with or by meddling in affairs of European nations."

The grand jurors will continue the inquiry into strikes in munition plants and explosions in factories and shipyards which have resulted already in the indictments of Representative Buchanan, of Illinois, and seven others.
