

MRS. LEE SHOT BY GABEL ONLY ONCE

Second Examination of Body Strengthens Accused Man's Story of Accident.

POWDER MAKES ONE MARK

Prisoner Sticks to Story That Rifle Was Placed at Woman's Breast in Fun—Dying Remarks of Victim Are Forgotten.

RECENT PORTLAND MURDERERS

October 24—Robert Broadnax, colored, was killed by C. W. Crawford at the latter's home, 187 Crawford street. A woman was the cause. The jury found a not-trust bill and dismissed the case.

Responsibility for the death of Mrs. Minnie Lee was not laid upon Albert Gabel by the coroner's jury which investigated the shooting last night.

Jury returned a verdict that Mrs. Minnie Lee came to her death from a bullet wound inflicted by a rifle in the hands of Albert Gabel, but confessed they were unable to determine whether the shot was fired intentionally.

Mrs. Minnie Lee was shot by Albert Gabel last week.

Gabel's story that the shooting of the woman with whom he was infatuated, in the bathroom on Williams street Sunday afternoon, was accidental was in a way substantiated, and the state's most vital evidence in presenting a charge of murder was destroyed by a discovery of the coroner yesterday.

Accident Story Maintained.

In fact, he relates, he pressed the rifle toward her body, and when she recoiled, the trigger, and in his surprise the rifle went off.

Prisoner Is Cool.

Regarding what Mrs. Lee said to him after she was shot, during the 20 minutes or so that she was lying on the floor, Mrs. Patterson and Hatfield were running for help, he says his memory is not clear.

Dying Remarks Forgotten.

"I don't remember what she said," declared Gabel on his stand yesterday morning, slightly nervous and begging for a cigarette. "I don't think she talked to me. She didn't blame me for shooting her. She only said she was conscious 15 or 20 minutes."
