

PERKINS ASSAILS BOTH OLD PARTIES

Charges of Progressive Disintegration Indignantly Denied by Leader.

NEED OF VIGOR ASSERTED

Chairman of Bull Moose at Dinner to Convention Delegates Declares Democrats and Republicans Unequal to Crisis.

CHICAGO, Jan. 10.—George W. Perkins, at a dinner given by him to the Progressive National Committee tonight, for the coming National campaign, asserted what he termed the "persistent charge that our leaders have abandoned their cause" by asserting that at the meeting tomorrow practically every state will be represented.

"As is always the case in great moral struggles," Mr. Perkins said, "we have had many discouragements, but I am sure I voice the sentiment of every man present and the thousands of loyal men and women whom each represents, when I say that we are glad we engaged in the struggle; that we have accomplished a vast deal of good for our country, and God willing, will accomplish a vast deal more."

Leaders Declared Active Still. "To the constant and persistent charge that our leaders have abandoned their cause; that our party is a mere paper organization, we answer that at tomorrow's meeting, practically every state will be represented by a National committeeman from the Progressive party; that 30 per cent of the men who led the fight in 1912 will be here in person or by proxy."

"Our country is entering the preliminary stages of a great National campaign. It is essentially time for the re-orientation of our party. The questions to be settled in the next few months are of the utmost importance. At no time since the Civil War has the country been in such a state of confusion as that which confronts the next Administration. The results of the war are bound to open up a new economic, socially, religiously, patriotically. Our country needs leadership—leadership with vision, courage and patriotism. In order to reach the solution of the problems confronting us."

The Democratic party has utterly failed in vision, in courage, in patriotism. At its hands our country prospered through accident and prepared for adversity through neglect. At its hands our National honor is sullied at home and degraded abroad.

Republicans Are Assailed. "The leaders of the Republican party are speechless in our country's great crisis. Only a few days ago they met at Washington for one of the most important sessions in the history of our country, and the men who claim to represent the hundreds of thousands of patriotic, forward-looking members of that party, openly confessed that they had no plan to do for the people, no thinking of the needs of the people."

GROWTH OF BANKS IS UNPARALLELED

Resources Gain \$1,743,878.648 in First Year Under Federal Reserve Plan.

2 BILLION DEPOSITS ADDED

Available Cash Increase is Nearly \$900,000,000. With Reserves \$891,000,000 More—Only National Banks in Report.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—"Development and growth" never paralleled in the financial history of our country," is the way John Skelton Williams, Controller of the Currency, today describes in his annual report to Congress the operation of the National banks under his charge, from October, 1914, to November, 1915, the first year under the Federal Reserve system.

Mr. Williams gives a comparative statement of the condition of the National banks November 15, 1914, says the report, "exceeded by \$87,000,000 the greatest reserves ever held prior to passage of the Federal reserve act."

Loans to Officers Opposed. "Banks," says Mr. Williams, "nearly always are broken by the tying up or withdrawal of the bank's funds through loans to their own officers and directors, or else by direct defalcations and embezzlements by trusted officers."
