VIEWES TOLD TO WILSON

Measure Designed to Strengthen National Guard, Which Would Be Taken Into Regular Army in Time of War.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11.—Plans to strengthen the National Guard instead of establishing a continental army as contemplated by the War Department were proposed to President Wilson today by Chairman Hay of the House military committee. Mr. Hay would not reveal how his suggestion was received by the President.

In discussing the declaration of principles issued by the committee, George W. Perkins, of New York, the chairman, said:

Preparedness Viewed as Guarantee

"We must insist upon the most thoroughgoing preparation to protect our rights against all possible attacks by any aggressors. Such preparedness is the best guarantee of any honorable peace."

"The construction of Federal regulations rather than the destructive destruction of efficient business organizations—behavior and not size being the test."

Equal Suffrage Favored

"The detachment of the invisible government."

"Because of the failure of the Wilson Administration to deal adequately with National home and industrial welfare, this country has continued a state of more far-reaching consequences than any since the Civil War."

American standards of justice. This means that the demand for complete preparedness, not merely in military armament, but preparedness that will mobilize our economic resources, agricultural and industrial, a preparedness that will unify American citizenship and create loyalty to our institutions such as peoples of other nations have not patriotically shown since the terrible test of war; the preparedness which creates a spirit of unselfishness and the ultimate object of which is universal peace, but a National spirit and soul which views the doctrine of peace at any price as futile, cowardly and unrighteous, and which will unhesitatingly make any needed sacrifice to uphold American standards of humanity and justice. Only that spirit will put this Nation where it can move effectively for the world peace which we desire.

Wilson Policy Criticized

The Wilson Administration has repudiated the faith of our forefathers, which made the American flag the sufficient protection of an American citizen against the world. It has suffered American men, women and children to be slaughtered in Mexico and on the high seas. American property to be destroyed and American citizens to be arrested and to be subject to the arbitrary and lawless coercion of foreign bullies. It has stood by while the law of nations disappeared from the earth without adequate protest or effective resistance. It first among American Administrations, has shown the explicit approval and the tacit acquiescence in the contempt of the world.

Clearly alive in this

"We pledge ourselves to approach the consideration of the issues involved in such an effort without any desire to revive partisan bitterness. If the Republican convention is responsive to the spirit of this action, the Republican party will be the party that will lead the nation to the next Presidential election."

They, when called upon again

"The great Montenegro stronghold, Mount Lovcen, has been a scene of last night's official Austrian statement. The attack has been largely assisted by Austrian warships and the guns of the Cattaro, the Austrians made abundant use of asphyxiating gas. A battle is raging on the slopes of the northern and eastern frontiers of Montenegro. On the east the Montenegrins have been compelled to evacuate Hercegovina."

For the British public

"The British public the latest statement regarding the situation in Mesopotamia will not entirely relieve the anxiety. The British General, Aylmer's, column, which is advancing the relief of Kut-el-Amara, has met and repulsed a strong Turkish force, but its present position is by no means satisfactory, for it finds in front of it a Turkish army greatly superior in number. Therefore it is evident that a successful junction of the two British forces, although they are only 20 miles apart, may prove difficult."

There have been no fresh developments

"The Russians are reported fortifying the positions they recently won and in this way their front has been gradually extended until they occupy about 54 miles of the east bank of the middle reaches of the Stripta River, a position which is deemed to be secure against recapture by the Austro-Germans."

John Redmond announced in Parliament

"John Redmond announced in Parliament that the Nationalists would not further oppose the military service bill. The resignations of Arthur Henderson, president of the board of education, and his two labor colleagues from the ministerial councils have not yet been accepted, and at a conference which the representatives of labor will hold with Premier Asquith tomorrow some agreement may be reached by which they will be retained in the government."

TUBE MILL STRIKE IS DECLARED OFF

Men at Youngstown, O., Accept Company's Offer of Increase of 10 Per Cent.

9500 WILL BE AFFECTED

Militia Regiments Probably Will Be Withdrawn Today—Rockefeller, Jr., Denies Interest in Big Steel Merger.

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Jan. 11.—Fred Croston, strike mediator, announced tonight that the strike of the tube workers at the plant of the Youngstown Sheet & Tube Company had been declared off. The men at a mass meeting tonight voted to accept the company's offer of an increase in wages amounting approximately to five per cent, and will return to work tomorrow.

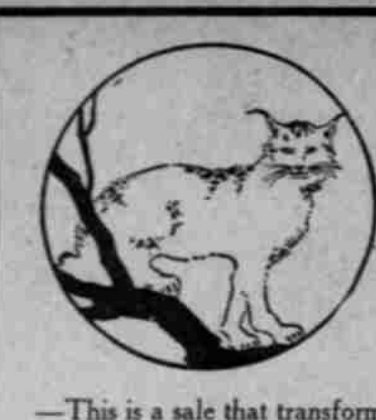
