Supreme Court Confirms Ownership of George Sykes and 135 Other Contestants.

PROEBSTEL APPEAL LOST

Decision by Higher Tribunal Also Rules in Astoria Case That Law Permitting Operation of Vessels by Ports Is Valid.

SALEM, Or., Jan. 11.—(Special.)—In an opinion by Justice Harris, the Supreme Court today declared that the law passed by the last Legislature giving ports the right to acquire and operate steamboats and other water craft was constitutional.

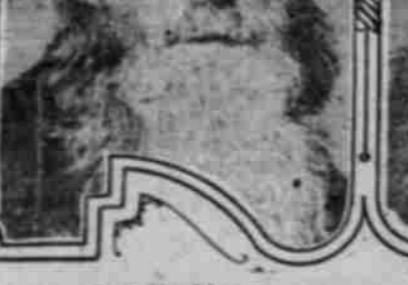
