MAN KILLS 3 AND SELFS

WOMEN OF SAN FRANCISCO ARE SHOT TO DEATH. Disrespectably Discharged Sailor Murders Women He Loved, Her Mother and Sister.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 12.—Floyd Peyster, a dishonorably discharged United States sailor, shot and killed three women today and then committed suicide.

After shooting Mrs. Hill Peyster also killed her mother, Mrs. G. W. Evans, and Mrs. Hill's sister, Irene White, and then, with two bullets left in the revolver, he turned the muzzle against his own head and fired twice.
