Storm Sweeping Northwest is Worst Experienced in Several Years.

TRAIN IS BURIED IN DRIFT

Depth of 25 Feet in Cascades is Reported—Slide, Delayed Streets, Broken Wires, Stock Suffering Are Results.

ASHLAND, Wash., Jan. 12.—(Special.)—Snow falling on Gray Harbor and six of Aberdeen's large sawmills were forced to close today, due to last night's heavy snowfall. Several Husqumilla mills also are down today. The snow has made more than 2000 men idle in this county. Loggers, however, are remaining in the camps to resume work at the earliest time.

TRAIN IS BURIED IN SNOW
