Colonel Theodoro Roosevelt, Oyster Bay, Long Island, N. Y., Shocked at the horror of events in Mexico and the wanton murder of 18 worthy, representative Americans in the State of Chihuahua...

"I have not the least doubt," he said, "that the Carranza forces will not rest until they have captured and punished the assassins. Each American killed received permission to go through the lines, but that permission should not be considered as a passport."

"The time has come when only Congress can act in the face of the criminal denial of respect for the American flag and the unfortunate who vainly depend on its protection."

"The Mexican issue is not a political one and we cannot insult the American Nation by subscribing to the maxim that we are 'too proud to fight' in defense of our hapless citizens who are thus horribly butchered in a foreign land."

"The solution of this great international problem must rest with the Congress, where your influence is known to be powerful and we respectfully request your aid in bringing about a settlement if other international complications do not stand in the way of just and speedy action."

MINE MEN JEER CONSUL

AMERICANS ASK OFFICIAL'S REMOVAL FROM JURISDICTION

Thomas D. Edwards Meets Unfriendly Crowd at El Paso, Who Complain to President.

EL PASO, Jan. 12.—Thomas D. Edwards, American Consul at Juarez, was received with shouts of criticism when he appeared in the lobby of a hotel filled with mining men today.

"Go back to Juarez, where you belong," was shouted at him by the mining men surging forward and around him.

"You ought to be proud of your friend," said Mr. Edwards calmly, and turning his back he strode from the lobby.

The criticism reached a climax in a lengthy petition to President Wilson to remove Consul Edwards at once.

The petition, after setting forth that the signers are all American citizens with Mexican interests, asked Consul Edwards' removal because he has for the last several years, during the conflict in Mexico, at all times shown either active indifference with reference to the wrongs committed against American lives or property in the district for which he is Consul, and has been too indolent or indifferent to attend any and have the least concern in the protection of American rights and interests.
