### E. C. HERLOW ASKS COURT FOR PAROLE

Petitioner Not Yet Imprisoned for Swindling Woman Out of \$3500.

### COMMITMENT IS RECALLED

Judge Morrow Awaits Action on Plea for Freedom—Convicted Man Says He Is Paying Half of Partner's Restitution.

Declaring that he has been paying W. H. Chapin by installments half of the \$1500 that Chapin paid to Mrs. William Gease in restitution, and by which Chapin obtained a pardon from ex-Governor West, E. C. Herlow now asks that he be paroled in a petition filed yesterday in the Circuit Court by R. E. Yonson, attorney for Herlow.

The fact, informally brought out in the trial, that \$1500 borrowed from Mrs. Gease previously to the time the \$1500 was taken for "investment in mortgage" has never been paid back, is ignored in the application. No further restitution is suggested for the woman and her aged husband, but the proposal simply is to relieve his ex-business partner of paying half the money by which Chapin obtained freedom.

Among those who suggested to Governor Witherspoon that such an arrangement should be made was Circuit Judge Morrow, before whom Chapin and Herlow were convicted, and who has withheld the commitment of Herlow in spite of protests from the District Attorney's office. The first commitment that was recalled by Judge Morrow was issued a year and a half ago, and the second week ago.

Chapin appealed to the Supreme Court and the decision of the lower court was affirmed. He then took up the matter of a pardon with Oswald West, then Governor. After much parleying Governor West granted the parole—upon his last official act—on the promise of Chapin, backed by friends, that the \$1500 due Mrs. Gease would be returned. Herlow prepared and filed a bill of exceptions with the purpose of appealing to the Supreme Court as well, but gave up this idea when Chapin's sentence was confirmed.
