Church failures in Lane County and inter-denominational remedy, an a remedy, an inter-denominational federation with unlimited resources in men and money to insure success, were pointed out by Rev. H. N. Morse, of New York, rural survey expert of the Presbyterian Church, to several hundred men at the Y. M. C. A. yesterday. Overlapping of fields was found by Rev. Mr. Morse to be the cause of failures in Lane County, which was taken as a county typical of the West. He said that one of every 10 churches was located in a section that would never be able to support it, or was so located as to divide the community and make co-operation with the Grange and other organizations impossible. Seventeen churches of the 132 in the county were abandoned, and many others on the point of giving up.
