PROGRAMME UPSET

Administration Reliance in Continental Army Proves Misplaced.

VIRGINIAN OPPOSES BILL

"Pork" Feature Looms Up in Meas ure Which Has National Guard Arrayed Against It and Military Committee Chairman.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 17.—Repudiation of the continental army plan by Representaive Hay, of Virginia, chairman House committee on military affairs was a severe blow to the Administra-tion's preparedness programme and presages trouble for the so-called Gar-rison idea, if the Administration con-tinues to press it.

Already, Senator Chamberlain had

cone on record as being against the continental army plan. Now a situation has arisen where the chairmen of both committees on military affairs take sharp issue with the Administration on one of the most important feaures of the National defense pro gramme submitted.

When the Administration formulated Its preparedness programme, copies of the bill approved by President Wilson and Secretary Garrison were sent to Senator Chamberlain and Representarenator Chamberlain and representa-live Hay. Senator Chamberlain re-strafted the bill, eliminating the con-tinental army, and introduced his own individual bill, in the preparation of which he was assisted by officers of the war college. He also introduced the militia pay bill.

Mr. Hay Counted Upon.

Representative Hay, on the other band, introduced the Administration bill, including the continental army and it was assumed he would be Administration leader of the preparedness fight in the House, or that part of the fight baving to do with

the army.
Now, however, Representative Hay
has come around to Senator Chamberlain's position and renounces the con-

lain's position and renounces the continental army plan, at the same time declaring strongly for the militia pay bill, on which he had been luke warm in times past, if, indeed, he was not hostile. Mr. Hay is adept at keeping his ear to the ground and his sudden change of position is attributed to the marked development of sentiment hostile to the continental army.

There is no reason to doubt that political expediency was a big factor in inducing the President and Secretary Garrison to take up and push to the front the continental army plan of creating a reserve. Notwithstanding publications to the contrary, the continental army idea is not generally regarded with favor by military men. But it is a plan which, it was believed, would appeal strongly to many Senaild appeal strongly to many Senators and Representatives.

"Pork" Factor Enters.

The continental army would neces sitate the maintenance of at least on sitate the maintenance of at least one army post in every state, where the continental army could assemble for drill and instruction, and where arms and equipment could be stored. The edoption of the plan would save every existing army post and would justify the establishment of a number of additional posts, all of which is in the nature of "pork."

Secretary Garrison and the President have been in office long enough to know the value of "pork" as a votegetter, and the enthusiasm with which they put forward the continental-army

they put forward the continental-army plan indicates that they did not over-

But in spite of the "pork" feature of the continental-army plan, the idea is constantly growing more unpopular, contrary to the assumption of the Administration, and one salient reason is the National Guard to the continental army. The National Guard is big enough to be considered a political


