The greatest number of students housed in any one building is at Jefferson High School, yesterday's registration showing a total of 1816, or a gain over last semester of more than 100.

The total number enrolled in all the high schools of the city yesterday was 6442. Of that number 373 are housed in the old Shattuck building, to which place the commercial department of the Lincoln High School has been moved.
