## AUTO REPAIRS DEFINED

MAN WHO PUTS ON TIRE ALLOWED TO FILE LIEN.

Moot Point Decided by Judge Morrow in Case of Tire Company Against Selling Concern.

A decision of interest to automobile and tire men throughout the state was handed down by Circuit Judge Morrow yesterday when he decided that a man who puts a new tire on an automobile may be classed as a repairman and therefore has a lien on the machine

The case in question was the suit of Albert Courts, proprietor of the Peerless Tire & Rubber Company, against T. E. Clark and the Mitchell, Lewis & Staver Company, for \$415.45 for selling and putting on three new tires for Mr. Clark. Mr. Clark did not complete paying for his automobile and the auto company contended that the bill of the tire company did not constitute a lien on the machine, and that they were not responsible for its payment.


