LOWER COLUMBIA REPORT IN

January Lumber Clearings Total 22 Cargoes, 2 Going Ahead.

ANTHOLIA, Or., Feb. 1.—(Special.)—During the month of January, 22 vessels steamed at the lower Columbia River district. Their combined cargoes amounted to 21,763,949 feet of lumber. Twenty-one of these vessels carried 20,489,000 feet of lumber to domestic ports, while two vessels with 1,274,949 feet of lumber are on route to foreign ports.
