220 BOMBS ARE DROPPED

Wider Area Than Ever Before Is Covered - Berlin Says Violent Fires Were Started in Several Large Cities.

LONDON, Feb. L-Fifty-four persons were killed and 57 injured in last night's Reppelin raid. The number of bombs dropped was estimated at 716. The figures were contained in ar

On the occasion of the last attack on London, made on the night of October 12, 32 persons were hilled and 114 wounded, according to an official statement.
