

LONDON HOPS RISE

Advance of Ten Shillings in Pacific Is Cabled.

SUPPLIES ABROAD SHORT

Nearly Seven Hundred Bales of Oregon Are Bought by Johnson in Hillsboro and Woodburn Sections—Other Purchases.

More interest in being taken in the hop market than at any time since the recent decline were reported by the Oregon Hop Growers' Association.

The sharp advance in the London market, which the first of the week, is estimated to be about 2 1/2 cents a pound on Pacific, continues advance later received of the strengthening of the market.
