

GIRL, 18, SENT TO JAIL

JUDGE LANGGUTH SAYS, "YOU ARE WORSE THAN HOUSEBREAKER."

Florence Benton, Warned to Cease Attempts to Lead Another Into Certain Society, Sentenced.

Because she sought to lead another girl toward the path of perdition, Judge Langguth sentenced Florence Benton to ten days in jail. The specific charge was vagrancy.

"You are a menace to society," the judge informed her. "You are worse than a housebreaker. If you appear again you may be certain that sentence will not be light as in this case."

Several days ago Florence Benton was told by the Women's Protective Division to cease her attempt at leading an Oak Grove girl into questionable society.

After the reprimand she wrote letters to the other girl, aged 18, bidding her come to this city without delay.

"The fellows want to see you," is the significant sentence she penned, it is said.

Florence Benton, the convicted vagrant, is only 18 years of age.
