Kenneth Webber Runs Away From Divorced Mother, Returning to "Dad."

COURT TO LISTEN TO LAD

Judge McGinn Defers Action Pending Investigation Into Charge of Kidnaping Made by ex-Wife of Jacob A. Webber.

Twice taken by legal action from the father, with whom 8-year-old Kenneth Webber declares he prefers staying, the court order awarding him to the custody of his mother, the younger son ran away from the Holy Cross school, where he was placed, going back to the home of his father for the second time Sunday.

CHURCH FUE IS TOPIC

Necessity for Co-operation by Denominations Asserted.

FAILURE CAUSE DISCUSSED

Missionaries From Many Lands Tell of Progress Made in Spread of Christianity and Need for Trained Men Emphasized.

Their crops were demanded. From merchants, wholesale and retail dry goods, groceries and hardware were requisitioned. Beasts of burden, camels, horses, mules and donkeys were collected in some districts. It would be difficult to find an animal fit for military purposes left. Foreign trade was cut off by blockade, so that with the exception of the interchange of native products commercial transactions practically ceased.

The calling to the colors of all men of military age left thousands destitute. In times of peace a large proportion of the population barely eke out an existence, but when so many breadwinners were compelled to abandon their families the resulting suffering was bitter in the extreme.

Spread of Christianity Shown.

In all strategic centers of Asia Minor were to be found evangelical congregations and schools throbbing with new life, striving after new ideals, the hope of the future of the country. There were 148 stations with 309 missionaries, men and women. Associated with these were 1218 native helpers. There were 153 organized churches, attended by congregations aggregating 60,000 souls. There were 452 colleges and schools attended by nearly 26,000 pupils. For the maintenance of this splendid enterprise the native people contributed last year close to \$200,000.

QUEEN ANNE HILL SLIPS

SEATTLE RESIDENCE BUILDINGS ARE TWISTED AND DAMAGED. Property Loss Is Estimated at About \$1,500—Mile Struck Slides—Filled-in Strip Suffers.

SEATTLE, Feb. 14.—The bluff of Queen Anne Hill, a fine residence district in the northern part of the city, has begun to slip toward the sea beach, beginning at Kinross Park and extending north to the top of the earth, has subsided two inches to two feet. A number of houses have been twisted, besides those wrecked by the slides in this district last week, and water and gas pipes have been broken. Large apartment-houses on the brow of the bluff have not been affected.

The worst damage is confined to a block of filled-in ground beginning at Olympic Place and extending along Ninth avenue west to Olympia Way. Half of the street in Ninth avenue west has settled from two to five feet, and three large frame houses built on the filled-in hillside settled from six to ten feet.

FROST REACHES FLORIDA

One of Winter's Coldest Waves Sweeps Atlantic States. WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—One of the winter's severest cold waves gripped the Atlantic states today. The coldest place was Canton, N. Y., with 38 degrees below zero.
