TAX PROPOSED AS CURE

SULZER WOULD ASSESS LIQUOR AT \$1000 A GALLON.

Local Option Called Fraud and Hobson Amendment Held Retarding Influence on Prohibition.

PITTSBURGH, Feb. 22.—A tax of \$1000 a gallon on all alcoholic liquors was advocated by ex-Governor Sulzer today before the Pennsylvania state prohibition convention.
