## SALEM RACES SET

State Fair Programme Offers Exceptional Interest.

## PURSES TO TOTAL \$16,500

Futurity Events Eliminated and 9 Running Races Put on Card. 2:12 Trot and 2:08 Pace to Be for \$2000 Each.

SALEM, Or., Feb. 23 .- (Special.)-The programme of races for the Oregon State Fair this year was completed to-day at a meeting here of the speed committee appointed by the State Fair Board. The six-day speed schedule this year, it is declared, will be of greater interest to the crowds in gengreater interest to the crowds in gen-eral than in the past, as the commit-tee has included nine running races. The Futurity events are eliminated, as these classes of events, the committee decided, were of interest mostly to the racing fraternity and breeders. The purses offered this year will reach a total of \$16,500, the commit-tee announced. As usual, the big days of the Fair racing card will be Wednes-day and Thursday, Salem and Fortland




