POWERS, Coos County, Oregon, Feb. 24.—Here we are in a brand new town, which is a hum-dinger of a place, considering that it is not yet on the published maps of Oregon.

Country is Admired. Leaving Myrtle Point we passed through one of the finest farming sections in Oregon, which is mostly devoted to dairying.

500 Work in Woods. In the woods around about 500 men are at work in the logging camps, and about 100 at other work here and on the railroads.

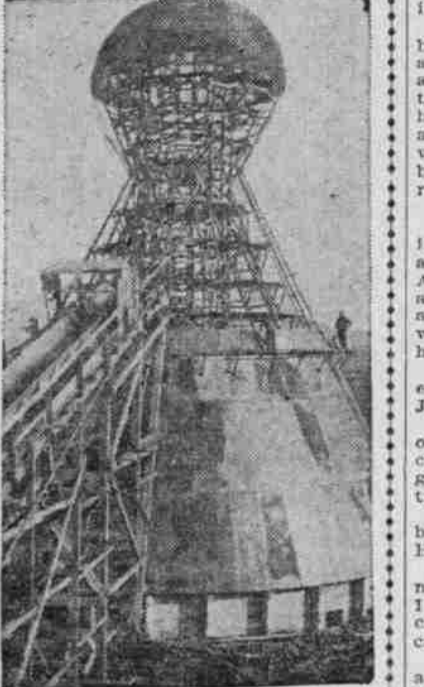

ment and does not need one, has a fine water supply of purest mountain water, a good electric light service generated by a plant in town; many blocks of plank sidewalk, heavy plank curbs and several blocks of paved streets. The town is built up in the fastness of the mountains, on the banks of the south fork of the Coquille, with mountains around it from 800 to 3500 feet high, and in the heart of one of the greatest timber belts in Oregon, 35 per cent of which is Port Orford cedar. Don't forget that—35 per cent of the logs now going out are cut into lumber, some of which is worth \$100 for each 1000 feet.

Paving Material Plentiful. I did not count the buildings, for that would be quite a job and take a long time. But there are about 40 large structures, and all in good construction. As to "paved streets," it can safely be said that Powers occupies a unique position. There are millions of tons of cement gravel in the south fork. When placed on a street this
