

# CHRISTIAN SCIENTIST DEFINES HIS FAITH

C. I. Ohrenstein, Member of  
Lecture Board, Gives Ad-  
dress at Second Church.

## JESUS' WORK IS DESCRIBED

Speaker Says God Is Supreme In-  
telligence—Man Is Command-  
ed to Preach and to Heal  
Through Knowledge.

Absolute Christianity was defined as "what Jesus taught, did and lived," by Charles I. Ohrenstein, member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship, who spoke to a large audience at Second Church of Christ, Scientist, East Sixth street and Holladay avenue, last night.

The speaker declared that Christ did his marvelous works because of his knowledge of their underlying principle or cause.

"It will be admitted," he said, "that this knowledge was the knowledge of God, the knowledge of the reign of the Kingdom of God, the knowledge of man and of man's relationship to God, which he came to teach mankind."

Answering the question, "What is God?" the speaker said: "When it is remembered that all that is called intelligence could not have formed the idea indicated by the least primary object, it will be appreciated that the great 'First Cause,' called God, must be supreme, infinite intelligence, or mind."

He emphasized the fact that Christ commanded his followers to heal as well as to teach.

**Healing Is Commanded.**  
"Those who were commissioned by Jesus to preach," he said, "were also commanded by him to heal. Not only did Jesus command his followers to preach and to heal, but he commanded them what to preach, and in the light of the Christian Science which he taught it was plain to them, as it is quite plain to Christian Scientists today, that what he commanded them to preach was intended to heal the sick, and to redeem the sinful. What was it that he told them to preach?"

"And as ye go, preach, saying, The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand."

"What is the kingdom of heaven?" "If we remind ourselves of the idea of God which Christian Science teaches, and which has just been indicated, we shall see that the kingdom of heaven which Jesus commanded his disciples to preach is indeed at hand, and that we are entitled to full enjoyment of this kingdom, for in God we live and move and have our being."

"Recognizing this as the place wherein we are to live, how many of us would behave unseemly, demean ourselves or others in any way, be chaste, or believe that there is something in our environment to injure, infect or impair us? Would that disease, or lack of ease, which is disease in the mind, be banished, that that ease and peace of being in the presence of our father, God, have possession of us."

**Kingdom at Hand.**  
"Teaching this, Christian Science shows it is not strange that the sermon which Jesus bade his disciples to preach should heal, and there will be nothing strange about it if many here are healed by learning and remembering that the kingdom of heaven is at hand, indeed, not only at hand, but, as Jesus also said, within you, within man."

Of the question, "What Is Man?" Mr. Ohrenstein said:  
"Jesus showed forth the perfect man, but not because of his physique. He said, 'The flesh profiteth nothing.' Can that which is truly man or woman be shown forth by mere flesh and blood? And God, the all-intelligent, all-powerful, eternal mind, spirit, life, truth and love, said: 'Let us make man in our own image, after our likeness.' So God created man in his own image, male and female created he them, and the godlike man is the only kind of man there is."

Mr. Ohrenstein said that the recognition that no man has any other trumation than that which Jesus has, led Mrs. Eddy to the discovery of Christian Science.

Mr. Ohrenstein was introduced by Attorney E. E. Hanes. The lecture will be repeated at the same place tonight and Thursday night at 8 o'clock.

## DEFENSE IS UPHELD

Methodist Ministers Indorse  
Preparedness Plans.

## PRESIDENT IS NOTIFIED

Maintenance of National Honor  
and Protection of All Amer-  
icans Supported—Final  
Vote Is Overwhelming.

Portland Methodist Episcopal ministers yesterday went on record as favoring preparedness, the protection of American citizens at home and abroad and the maintaining of the honor of the Nation's flag. A resolution embodying those principles was passed at the meeting of the Methodist ministers, held at the First Methodist Episcopal Church yesterday, following a stormy session. The final vote was overwhelmingly in favor of preparedness.

A copy of the resolution was immediately wired to President Wilson.

The question of preparedness came up at the meeting of the Methodist ministers a week ago. At that time a verbal resolution favoring preparedness was adopted. The result of the opposition which immediately developed final action was postponed until yesterday.

The resolution as finally passed follows: "To the President: The Portland, Or., Methodist preachers, meeting here, cry sustains you and the National Congress in your efforts to care for the safety and peace of the country; to protect American citizens and American interests at home and abroad, on land and on sea, and in all necessary preparation to maintain the honor of the Nation's flag."

The resolution was signed by Rev. C. O. McCulloch, Rev. C. E. Cline, Rev. Frank L. Loveland and Rev. E. J. Hoadley. A. P. Cramer, secretary, who was not in favor of the resolution, desired that his name be withheld.

Additional supporters of the resolution as finally passed were Rev. S. H. Dewart and Rev. E. O. Eldridge.

Ministers who took the opposing side included: Rev. T. W. Lane, Rev. C. C. Rarick, Rev. R. E. Smith and Rev. J. A. Hanpdon.

## H. H. RIDDELL SENTENCED

FOUR MONTHS IN JAIL AND \$2500  
FINE IMPOSED.

Judge Bean, Answering Plea for Mercy,  
Declares There Must Be Prison  
Terms in Such Cases.

Four months in the County Jail and a fine of \$2500 was the sentence imposed by Federal Judge Bean yesterday on H. H. Riddell, Portland attorney and secretary of the Oregon Inland Development Company. Mr. Riddell was convicted of having used the mails to defraud in connection with the sale of alleged orchard land.

Wallace McCamant, attorney for Mr. Riddell, emphasized Mr. Riddell's good reputation and the fact that the trial jury had recommended leniency. He asked the court to take this into consideration and impose a fine only. This Judge Bean declined to do.

"The court is not justified in disposing of such cases with a fine, except when there are exceptional circumstances," he said. "There ought to be a prison sentence, though the length of the sentence is not so important. The court should not make it possible for a man to promote a fraudulent scheme, expecting to be fined and estimating his profits as a matter of

speculation. But in passing this sentence I desire to err on the side of mercy rather than on the side of extreme justice.

"From the testimony it is apparent that this company had no other purpose than to sell something that didn't belong to it. In this Mr. Riddell was a party."

Execution of the sentence was stayed pending the preparation of a bill of exceptions for Mr. Riddell by Attorney McCamant. This will take about 40 days.

## CROSSING BID IS ACCEPTED

Coast Contracting Company to Do  
Work at Fairview for \$87336.

The Coast Contracting Company was awarded the bid for the Fairview underground crossing by the Board of County Commissioners yesterday after the recommendation of Roadmaster Yeon. Seven bids were received and that of the successful bidder was lowest by nearly \$2000. It was for \$87336.

The deed of dedication for the Marquam Hill road was turned over to the county yesterday by the O-W-R. & N. Company.

The bid of \$550 by the St. Johns Lumber Company on lumber to be used in repairing the ferry W. S. Mason was accepted by the Commissioners on the recommendation of Superintendent Welch.

## CHAMBER SELECTS TWO

F. B. Riley and Colonel Baker to  
Attend Naval Base Convention.

Frank Branch Riley and Colonel David J. Baker, Jr. have been named by the Chamber of Commerce to represent it at the preparedness conference at Spokane, March 27-28. This appointment was announced yesterday, following the receipt of the official invitation to send a delegation to the conference.

The principal work at the meeting in Spokane will be to organize a committee of the Inland Empire and Columbia basin, in behalf of the establishment of a naval base of the first class at the mouth of the Columbia River.

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Long Island is agitating a project for constructing a canal along the south shore to connect the great bay for a distance of 120 miles. It would reach New York harbor through Jamaica Bay.
