STREET EXTENSION TO BE DISCUSSED.—Extension of East Burnside street at two points will be up for consideration today. The first section of the street is between East Fourth and East Fifty-fifth street, where there is no street at present, a distance of 11 blocks and the cross streets. Extension of East Burnside street from East Sixth-third to the intersection of East Sixty-ninth street and Thurburn avenue is the second section of the extension. Connection with Thurburn avenue, which is the North Mount Tabor branch of the Base Line road, connects East Burnside street with the Base Line road. Action of the opening of East Burnside street was started by the East Burnside Street Improvement Association about three years ago.
