



office is established in the Oregon building. Heretafore Oregon has been included in the district in charge of Commercial Agent W. B. Henderson, with head-quarters at Seattle. Co-operative district offices, partic-ularly the Portland office, have a wide range. They are maintained in close connection with local commercial bodies and, in the case of Portland, with the University of Oregon as well. Thus Mr. Clark, aside from his duties as a purely Governmental representa-tive, will collaborate closely with the Portland Chamber of Commerce as well as the commercial bodies of every city in the state, and, in addition, will de-liver a series of trade addresses to the students of the University of Oregon. The Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce is charged by law with the duty of "developing the various manu-facturing industries of the United States and markets for their products at home and abroad by gathering and publishing useful information, or by any other available method."




