overnor Withycombe presented the matter to the other members of the highway commission and the advisory board today, pointing out that while he had the appointment of the Chief Deputy Engineer under the law and presumably the right of dismissing him, he wished to ascertain the views of the commission and advisory board. At the commission meeting last month, Lewis had recommended that Cantine be dismissed on the ground that there was little work in the department for him to do now, that it would save the state money and that it would restore harmony in the department.
